## JTG 4-5-6-7 Work Program

- JTG received 131 input documents, including liaison statements from concerned working groups, views on frequency bands under study, elements for sharing studies and proposals for Draft CPM text.
- 16 Draft New Reports were agreed and sent to working groups for consideration

- 16 Working Documents towards Proposed Draft New Reports and Proposed Draft New Reports and Recommendations were attached to the Chairman's Report

# JTG 4-5-6-7 Work program

- For WRC-15 agenda item 1.1, the draft CPM text indicates the following frequency bands as “**potential candidate frequency bands**”:
  - 470-694/698 MHz, 1 350-1 400 MHz, 1 427-1 452 MHz,
  - 1 452-1 492 MHz, 1 492–1 518MHz, 1 518–1 525MHz,
  - 1 695-1 710 MHz, 2 700-2 900 MHz, 3 300-3 400 MHz,
  - 3 400-3 600 MHz, 3 600-3 700 MHz, 3 700-3 800 MHz,
  - 3 800-4 200 MHz, 4 400-4 500 MHz, 4 500-4 800 MHz,
  - 4 800-4 990 MHz, 5 350-5 470 MHz, 5 725-5 850 MHz, and
  - 5 925-6 425 MHz.
- For a frequency band to be included in this list, JTG 4-5-6-7 developed the following criteria: a band must have been proposed by an administration and have been studied by JTG 4-5-6-7
